## How to reach the Chair for Experimental Physics I, University of Bayreuth

We are in the building NW I, section 5.3, ground floor (cf. Campus map below).

## Visiting by car

Bayreuth can be reached best via the **Autobahn A9** (Berlin-Munich). Get off at the exit <u>Bayreuth Süd</u>. Follow the traffic signs towards <u>Bayreuth</u> and <u>Universität</u>. You may also consult an online map before your travel.

Alternatively, Bayreuth can also be reached via the **Autobahn A70** (Schweinfurt-Bayreuth). Get off at <u>*Kulmbach/Neudrossenfeld*</u> and follow the traffic signs towards <u>*Bayreuth*</u> and <u>*Universität*</u>. For this route it is recommended to consult an online map before your travel.

## Visiting by train

Bayreuth can be reached directly from the larger DB railway hub Nuremberg (Nürnberg). Trains leave Nuremberg main station on an hourly basis; the travel time is approximately 1h. Please consult <u>www.db.de</u> for a detailed travel plan.

Arriving in Bayreuth you may either take a Taxi in front of the main station (use the campus map below for instructing the driver) or take the bus (see <u>www.vgn.de</u> for current connections). Sportive visitors may also walk (about 30 minutes, please consult an online map before your travel).

## Visiting by plane

The next airport to Bayreuth is Nuremberg with a fair number of Domestic and European connections (see <u>www.airport-nuernberg.de</u> for details).

The closest international airports are Frankfurt (<u>www.frankfurt-airport.de</u>) and Munich (<u>www.munich-airport.de</u>) from which you can reach Bayreuth by train (see <u>www.db.de</u> for a detail travel plan).
