

## How to reach the Chair for Experimental Physics I, University of Bayreuth

We are in the building NW I, section 5.3, ground floor (cf. Campus map below).

### Visiting by car

Bayreuth can be reached best via the **Autobahn A9** (Berlin-Munich). Get off at the exit Bayreuth Süd. Follow the traffic signs towards Bayreuth and Universität. You may also consult an online map before your travel.

Alternatively, Bayreuth can also be reached via the **Autobahn A70** (Schweinfurt-Bayreuth). Get off at Kulmbach/Neudrossenfeld and follow the traffic signs towards Bayreuth and Universität. For this route it is recommended to consult an online map before your travel.

### Visiting by train

Bayreuth can be reached directly from the larger DB railway hub Nuremberg (Nürnberg). Trains leave Nuremberg main station on an hourly basis; the travel time is approximately 1h. Please consult [www.db.de](http://www.db.de) for a detailed travel plan.

Arriving in Bayreuth you may either take a Taxi in front of the main station (use the campus map below for instructing the driver) or take the bus (see [www.vgn.de](http://www.vgn.de) for current connections). Sportive visitors may also walk (about 30 minutes, please consult an online map before your travel).

### Visiting by plane

The next airport to Bayreuth is Nuremberg with a fair number of Domestic and European connections (see [www.airport-nuernberg.de](http://www.airport-nuernberg.de) for details).

The closest international airports are Frankfurt ([www.frankfurt-airport.de](http://www.frankfurt-airport.de)) and Munich ([www.munich-airport.de](http://www.munich-airport.de)) from which you can reach Bayreuth by train (see [www.db.de](http://www.db.de) for a detail travel plan).
